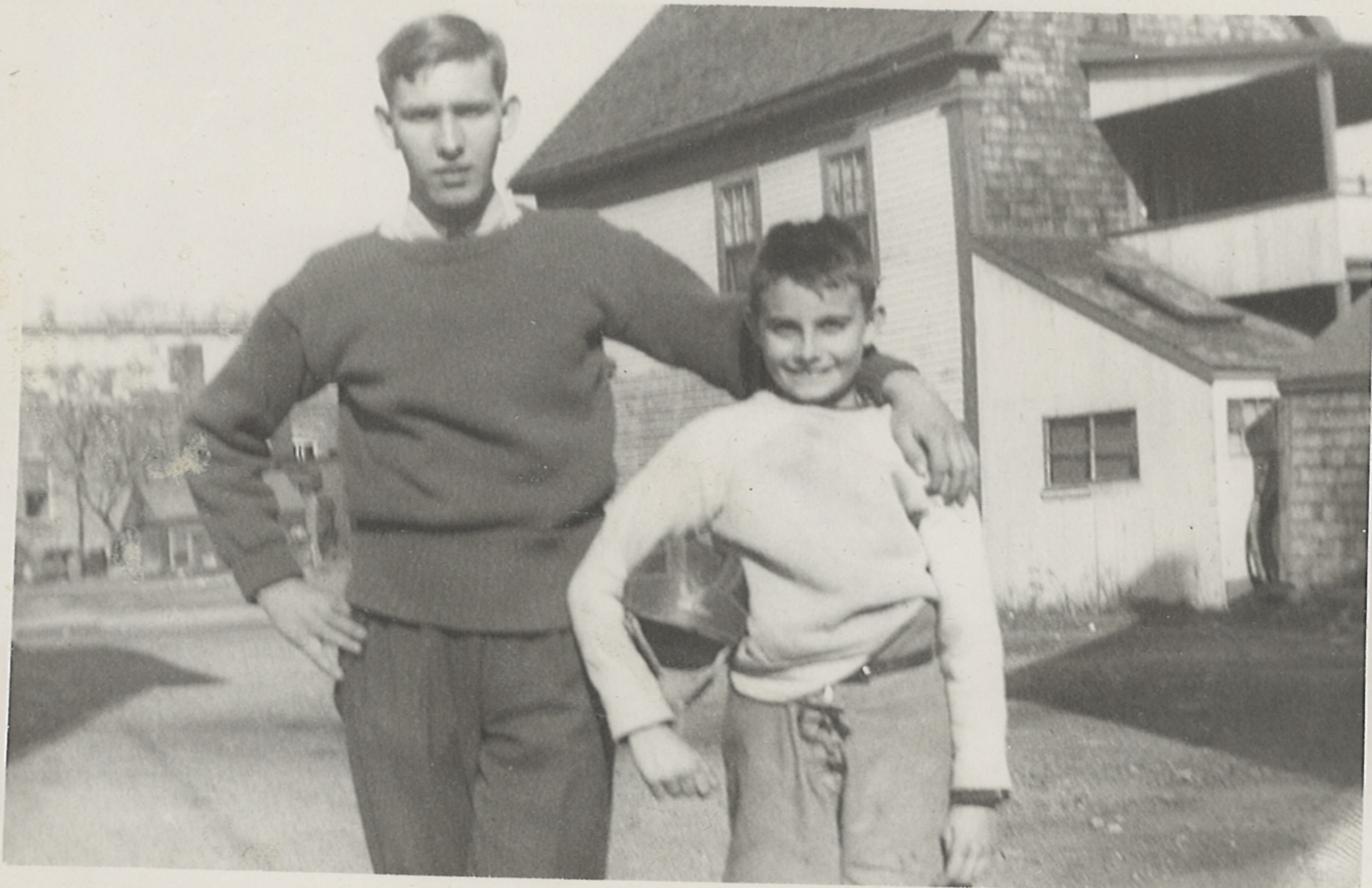

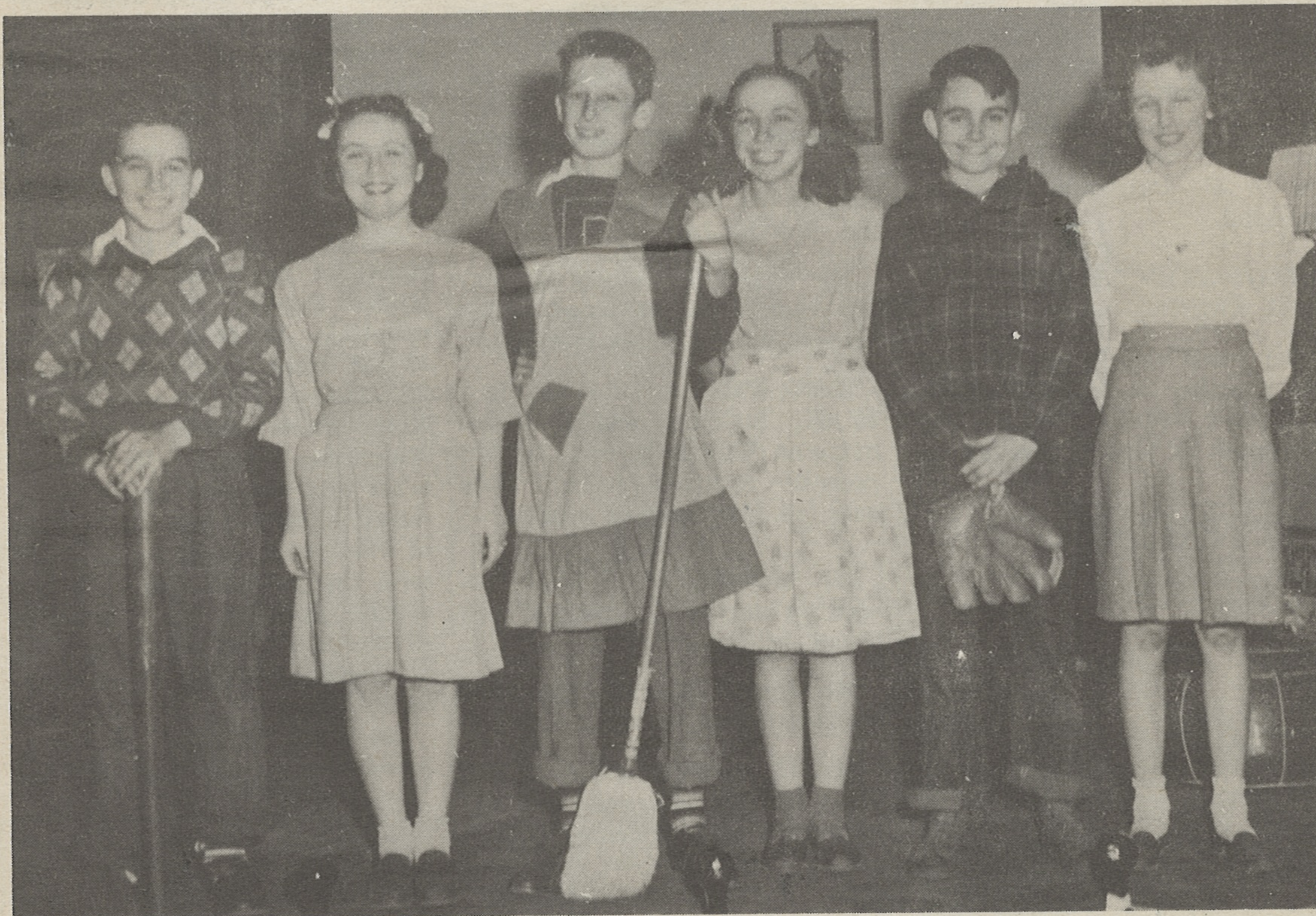

Death Takes Fr. Callahan

WAREHAM, June 22.—Rev. Francis J. Callahan, pastor of St. Patrick's church for more than 20 years, died Monday afternoon.

Many Brockton district residents who have summered at Onset mourned the death of Fr. Callahan, for up to a short time ago he also was spiritual director of St. Mary's church at Point Independence. He was instrumental in the erection of the beautiful new church at the popular summer resort.

Fr. Callahan was active in the advancement of his parish and supervised the building of the new church on High street. He attended public schools in North Easton, his birthplace, and was graduated from Holy Cross College and St. Bernard's Seminary, Rochester, N. Y. He was curate at St. Mary's Cathedral in Fall River for a number of years prior to being transferred to Wareham in January, 1927.

He was president of the South Shore Hospital Association. He was ordained a priest by the late Bishop Feehan and would have observed the 36th anniversary of his priesthood to-day.

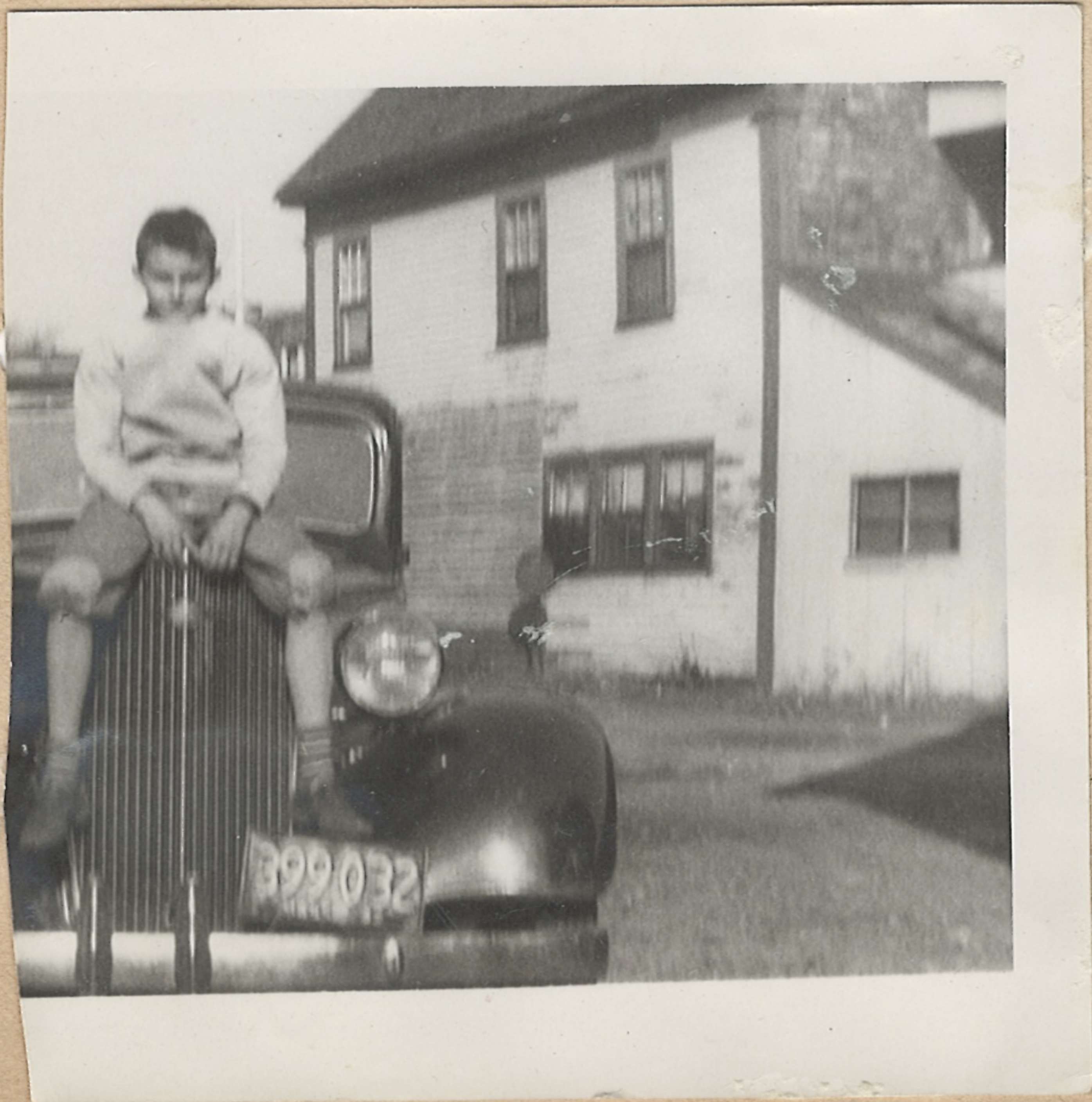
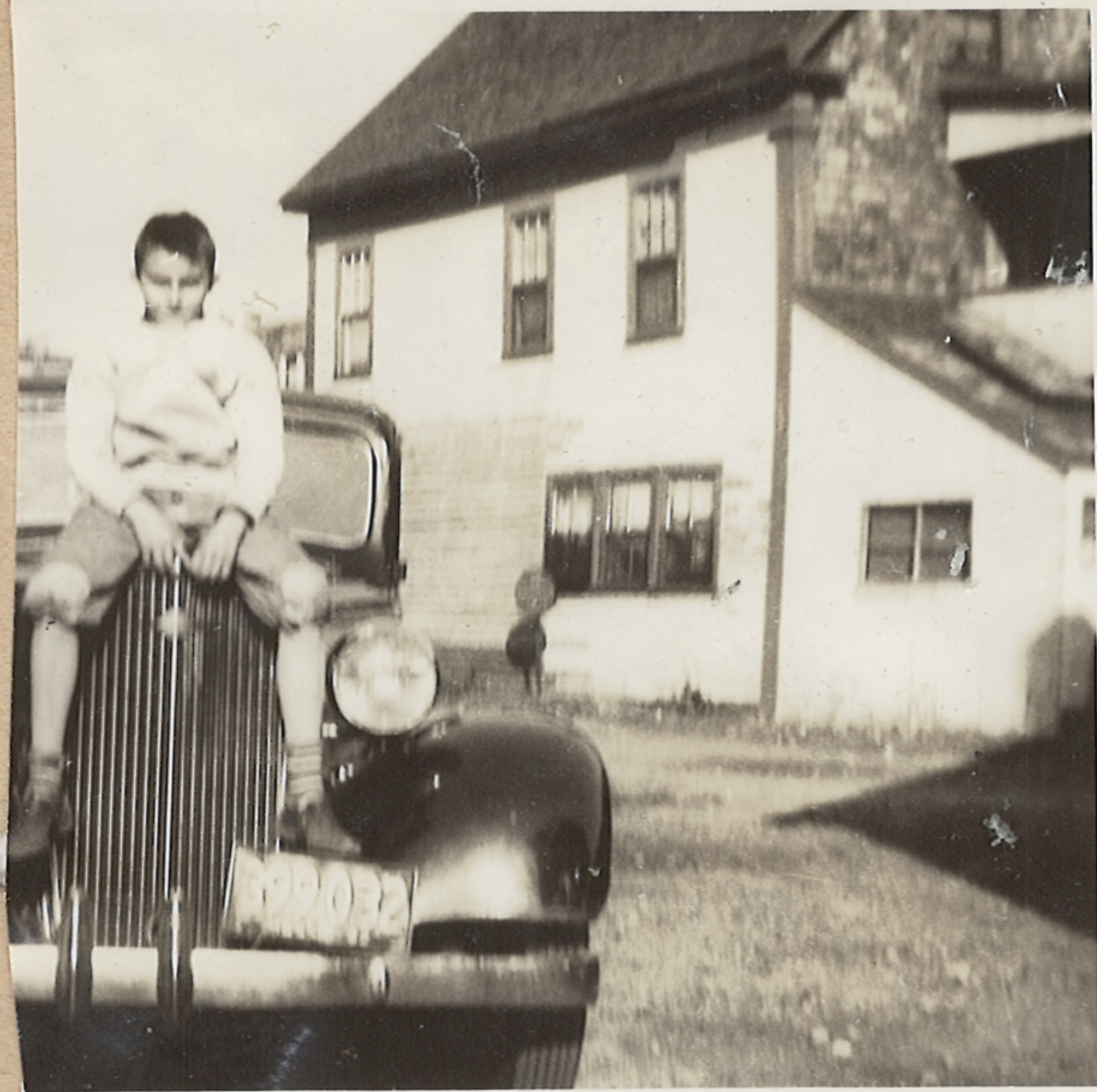

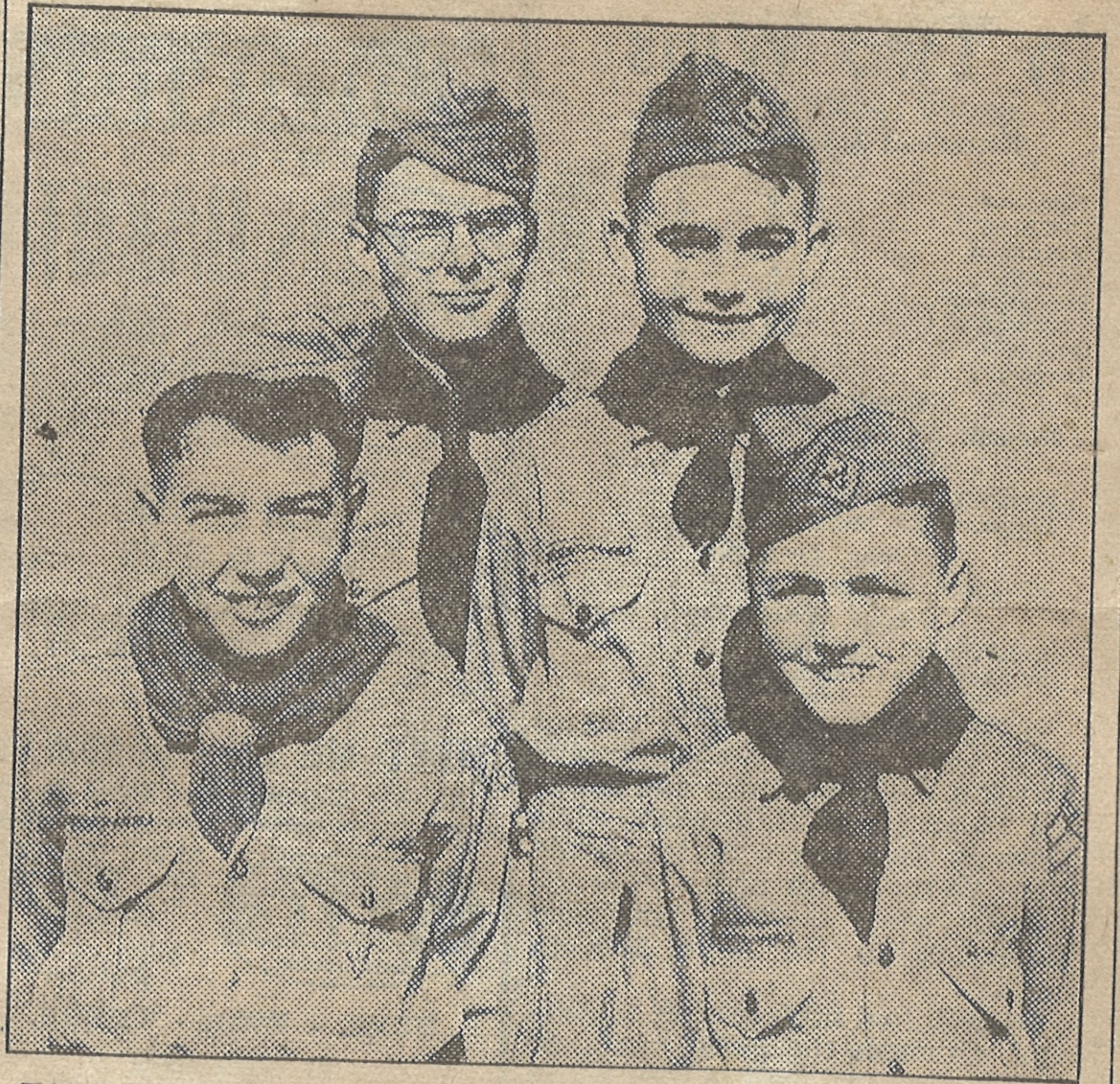
Wearing lettered jerseys and with taped wrists, they put up a professional appearance. On Friday, Aug. 10, the group performed for the *Courier* cameraman.

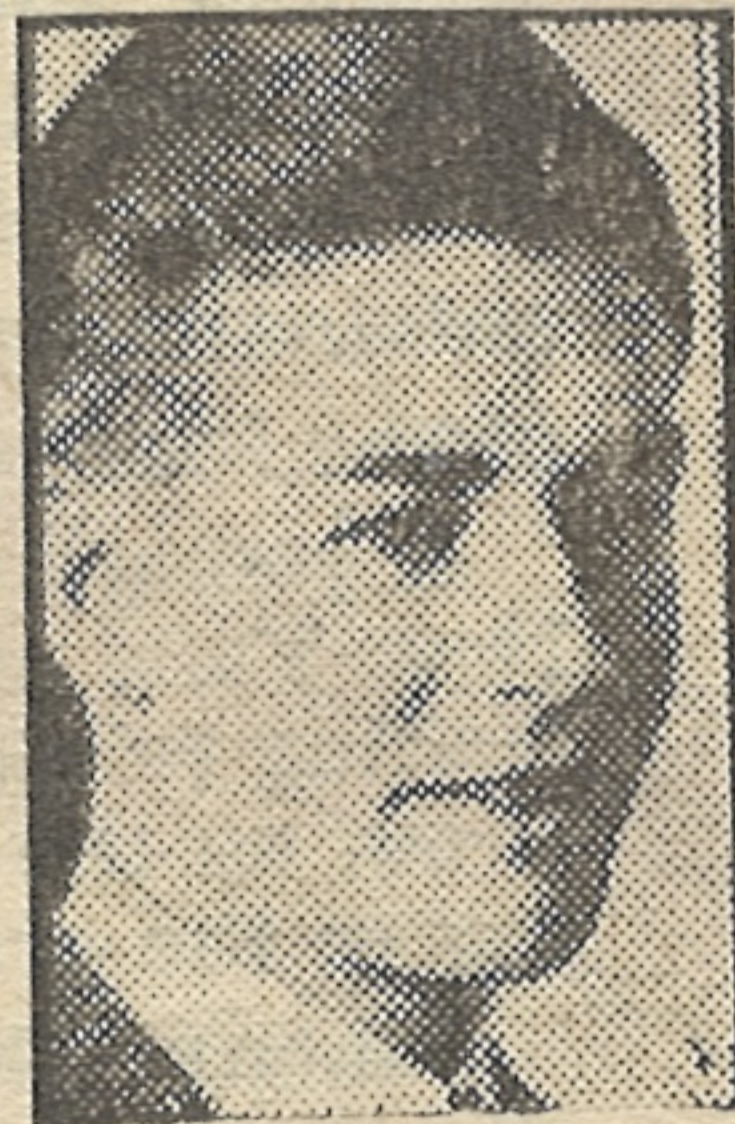

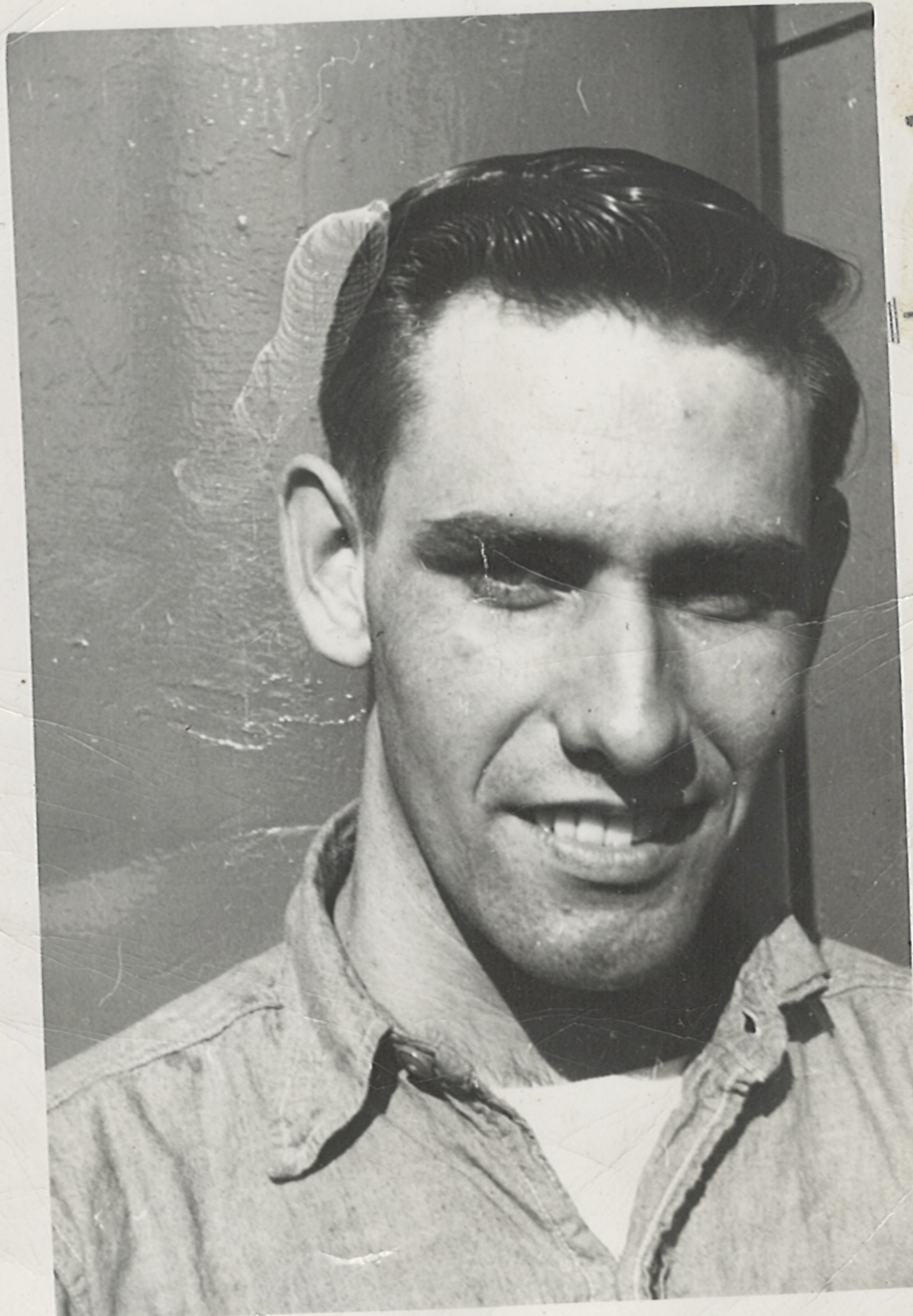
