TODAY CHRIST NEEDS NEW APOSTLES




WHAT ABOUT YOU?


Mr. Figueroa, 84, died Wednesday after a long illness. He was born in Kingston, British West Indies, and came to New York when he was 19. He lived in Richmond Hill 43 years at 103-36 108th St.

He retired in 1952 as an inspector in Brooklyn for the Department of Water Supply, Gas and Electric. He had been with the city 41 years.
