

BE IT REMEMBERED that I, ANNIE M. CONLON, sometimes called Ann Conlon, of Whitman, in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, being of sound mind and memory, do make this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all former wills by me at any time heretofore made.

After the payment of my just debts and funeral charges, I bequeath and devise as follows:

1. All the rest, residue, and remainder of my estate, real, personal, and/or mixed, wherever situated, of which I may be seised or possessed at the time of my death, including but not limited to the real property devised to me by my late brother Martin J. Conlon, I give, devise, and bequeath absolutely in fee simple to my nephew Joseph F. Conlon, of said Whitman.

2. I nominate and appoint my said nephew Joseph F. Conlon to be the executor of this my last will, and I direct that he be exempt from giving any surety or sureties on his official bond.
